#### **CFAC & MISSOULA COUNTY SMALL AG CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP**



#### **NEW! FARMER TOOL LIBRARY LAUNCHING SPRING 2024**

Access to the right tools and equipment is vital for small-scale, beginning farmers and ranchers to succeed. Our new Farmer Tool Library will operate as an equipment-sharing resource to support beginning farmers and rancher through affordable access to tools and workshops! The Farmer Tool Library will provide the training, knowledge, tools, and technical assistance to help producers establish and maintain viable farming operations!





**CFAC** is piloting a NEW Nutrition Education series partnering with schools, other non-profits, and healthcare organizations to provide unique public and private nutrition classes to Montanans of all ages!

The school-based part of the program, "Kids Who Cook!", teaches 3rd and 4th graders easy, healthy, and affordable recipes they can make by themselves at home. Other partners are All Nations Health Center and YWCA.
